During this period, I have met and worked with some of the most fascinating and knowledgeable minds who share my passion for discovery and love of the cultures of the Far East. There is bustling Bangkok, the fabulous archaeological site at Ayutthya and vibrant Saigon, in Vietnam.

Jan 2, Tue Check-in at Los Angeles
Evening check-in at JFK or LAX at Cathay Pacific.

Jan 3, Wed Departure to Lotusland
Board your widebody flight. Cross the International Dateline and lose one day.

Jan 4, Thu Arrival in Singapore D
You'll be met and transferred to the Carlton Hotel (or similar), within close walking distance of the synagogue. Free time to adjust to the time change. Afternoon orientation tour including the Cricket Club and Little India with its fragrant spices and joss sticks. Dinner at the historic Magen Aboth Synagogue where you'll meet a special guest. Rabbi Safman will discuss her experiences as rabbi of the Jewish Community of Singapore. You'll learn of the first Prime Minister of Singapore, David Marshall, who was also president of the Jewish Community.

Jan 5, Fri Singapore B,L,D
Visit Parliament House, the world famous marina incl. a boat ride on the river to the spectacular Gardens by the Bay, and Synagogue Chesed El, built by Sir Menasseh Meyer, patriarch of the Community. You will also meet a local rabbi who is unique in being Sephardic and also a follower of Chabad. Services and dinner at Magen Aboth.

Jan 6, Sat Shabbat in Singapore B,L,D
Shabbat Shalom. Afternoon visit to the home of a local member of the Jewish Community. This evening enjoy a night safari to see the exotic nocturnal creatures unique to Asia.

Jan 7, Sun Botanic Gardens ~ to Bangkok B,(L),D
Visit the exotic gardens where you will see a spectacular variety of orchids and other tropical flora. This afternoon, fly to Bangkok. Upon arrival, you'll be transferred to the Rembrandt Hotel (or similar).

Jan 8, Mon The King & You B,L,D
Travel by boat on "the River of Kings" to the Temple of Dawn and the shimmering Grand Palace, royal court of the kings of Siam. Lunch at "the backpacker's shul". Then visit the museum of Jim Thompson, who made "Thai silk" a household name. A private reception at Bangkok's leading fine arts gallery where you will meet special invited guests including Ruth Gerson, a long-standing resident of Bangkok and author of the classic text, *Traditional Festivals in Thailand*.

Jan 9, Tue Ancient capital of Siam B,L,D
Morning tour of ancient Ayutthya, capital of the kingdom of Siam and UNESCO World Heritage Site. The sheer number and size of the ancient temples attest to the former magnificence of the ancient city including the much photographed Ban Pa-In, the "Summer Palace" of the king.

Jan 10, Wed Fly to Northern Thailand B,L,D
A brief flight to Chiangmai in Thailand's mountainous north. Check-in at Imperial Mae Ping Hotel (or similar). Evening tour of the 'old town' where internet cafés coexist with sacred temples.

Jan 11, Thu In Chiangmai B,L,D
See the countryside of dense rainforest interspersed with waterfalls, on your hilltribe tour including rice paddies, Wat Doi Suthep and San Kamphaeng.

Jan 12, Fri Fly to Myanmar (Burma) B,L,D
Early afternoon arrival in Yangon where you will visit the historic and spectacular Shwedagon Pagoda covered in solid gold. Check-in at the Park Royal Hotel (or similar). Shabbat at the historic Musmeah Yeshua Synagogue, with its soaring ceiling and beautiful columns, within close walking distance of the hotel. Rabbi Safman will discuss her unique experiences in Southeast Asia and reveal why more than 120 Torah scrolls were in a remote synagogue in Burma.

Jan 13, Sat Shabbat in Yangon B,L,D
Shabbat Shalom. You'll meet the families of the small Jewish community and learn of the escape of the Jewish community from Japanese occupation in WWII. A Shabbat to remember. This evening, visit Bogyoke Market and other sights.

Jan 14, Sun Bagan excursion B,L,D
Rudyard Kipling called Burma "the pearl of Asia" and having been isolated for so many years, it is one of the few untouched, unspoiled destinations in the world today. This morning, fly to Bagan, the cradle of Myanmar culture and known as "the city of 4 million pagodas" incl. famous Khay Min Ga Temple. Return to Yangon in the evening.

Jan 15, Mon Flight to Vietnam B,(L),D
Morning at leisure. Midday flight to Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon). Check-in at the historic Rex Hotel (or similar). From the rooftop, you look over the entire city and the Saigon River meandering through the bustling metropolis. This evening, enjoy a cruise on the Saigon River.

Jan 16, Tue Don't "Miss Saigon" B,L,D
City tour including Independence Square and famous Rue Catinat. Ride a cyclo through the marketplace for a unique experience. Stroll through exotic Ben Thanh Market and visit the synagogue for a fascinating talk with the Chief Rabbi of Vietnam.

Jan 17, Wed Cu Chi & Rice Paddies B,L,D
See the lush rice fields and bamboo bridges enroute to Cu Chi to explore the incredible honeycomb of tunnels that housed an army of Viet Cong during the Vietnam War. Farewell dinner this evening where Rabbi Safman will summarize the unique Jewish experience in Southeast Asia.

Jan 18, Thu Return Home B
Transfer for your return flight to the USA. In re-crossing the Dateline, you'll arrive this same day. *Bon voyage.* #

Rabbi Rachel Safman is the spiritual leader of Congregation Beth El in New London, Connecticut. A graduate of the Ziegler School of Rabbinical Studies, Rabbi Safman was synagogue president of Singapore 2006-8, assistant professor of sociology at the National University of Singapore, and one-time lay leader of several kehillot in Southeast Asia including Thailand. Rabbi Safman is committed to extending Jewish resources to remote and under-served constituencies around the world. This will be her pioneering tour with the Foundation for Remote Jewish Communities (FRJC) founded by Rabbi Marvin Tokayer, a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization dedicated to preserve and promote endangered Jewish communities on the periphery of the Diaspora.

About Rabbi Marcia Tilcin

A graduate of both The Jewish Theological Seminary of America and the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies, Rabbi Marcia Tilcin served Conservative synagogues in Upper Nyack, New York and Tustin, California from 1998 to 2015 prior to founding the Jewish Collaborative of Orange County (JCoOC). Rabbi Tilcin sits on the board of the Orange County Interfaith Network (OCIN) and is the Executive Director of the Orange County Alliance for Just Change (OCAJC). Her travels with Rabbi Marvin Tokayer to India and Southeast Asia opened her eyes to this precious and unknown aspect of Jewish history and she is delighted to be partnering with former classmate and dear friend, Rabbi Rachel Safman, to lead this tour.

Terms & Conditions

Air transportation via scheduled IATA airlines, on round-trip economy-class group fare basis.
